

<p style="text-align: center;">INFORMATION SHEET FOR VETERINARIANS RADIOGRAPHS FOR THE TRAKEHNER STALLION MARKET 1.-3. DECEMBER 2022</p>
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Solely digital radiographs using the DICOM 3.0 file format must be submitted to Pferdeklinik Bargteheide by email or stored on CD or USB flash drive. No CD is necessary if pictures are transmitted online using the DICOM standard. Good quality pictures form the prerequisite for proper veterinary interpretation. The expected standard is set by the current 2018 version of the Röntgenleitfaden (x-ray guidelines). In the event of radiographic findings which require additional x-rays for clarification, these pictures have to be taken.

All x-rays taken not earlier than **1. September 2022** are admissible.

When being taken, all **18** radiographs must be unchangeably and unmistakably labelled and attributable to a horse with absolute certainty. All pictures must be labelled with:

Owner of the horse and/or owner's representative
Name and pedigree of horse
life number, age, sex of horse
x-rays taken on (date)
x-rays taken by (vet, clinic)

The following x-rays should be taken with the **horse sedated and without shoes** using physical markers:

- front hooves left and right 90° centred at the coffin joint
- front digit left and right (90°) centred at the fetlock joint
- Oxspring front, left and right, viewing of the fetlock joint space
- hind digit left and right (90°)
- tarsal/ hock joint left and right (0°, 45°-60° und 115°)
- stifle joint left and right (90°-110° und 180° = PA)

For organisational reasons, radiographs received after this date cannot be considered, which will exclude the stallion from participation!

The radiography committee reserves the right to request additional pictures to improve interpretation. Deficient or poor quality pictures must be repeated in any case. In the event that radiographs do not meet minimum requirements in terms of technique and quality, a stallion's eligibility for inspection cannot be stated.

To protect exhibitors, organizer, and veterinary surgeons against liability claims, the radiography commission is reliant on good quality x-rays for evaluation.
